

## Q: How can schools and businesses collaborate?

**Bob Horan**: As chair of the Chamber's Economic Development Committee, one of our goals this year is to connect businesses and education in meaningful ways. It's clear that when the two work together, both sides benefit. A great example is the connection between students in the Schodack Central School District and Next Advance, Inc.

Hollywood Drive-in Theatre is a real labor of love for owner Frank Fisher, whose parents, James and Beatrice, built the business in 1952. Today, the 400car theater is a monument to nostalgia, attracting patrons from the Capital District and nearby Massachusetts with its double-feature movies, digital

projection, Dolby sound, food concession stand and money-saving prizes in popcorn boxes. Located on Route 66 (even the location is nostalgic), just eight miles outside of Troy, Hollywood Drive-in is a seasonal treat for all ages.

"I've been here since I was five and was running a projector by the time I was 12. When you do that, it becomes part of you," said Fisher, who took over the family business in 1968. "I love it because it's just a fun place to be. You can't beat the price of two movies for \$10 (\$5 for ages 5-10). People come here and relax, they have fun with their families or their dates. They laugh. I really enjoy seeing that. There are only a few hundred drive-in theaters left in the United States and they are part of our history. We want to keep this one going."

Hollywood's patrons agree. They come to relive a favorite American pastime in Fisher's preserved time capsule and to introduce the next generation to the joy of watching "the Stars under the Stars." Arriving as early at 6:30 p.m. for a 9 p.m. showing, they make themselves comfortable with lawn chairs, beach blankets and treats from the full-service concession stand, including fresh pizza, nachos, hot dogs, hamburgers, fries, popcorn, candy and beverages. Tuning in their car radios to the digital sound system, they view current blockbusters on a newly resurfaced 36-foot-by-88-foot screen in the great outdoors.

"It's a whole different experience than sitting on your sofa or in a movie house," said Fisher, whose business relies on food concession profits to pay costly film royalties. "We offer neat, clean facilities, a freshly mowed parking area and a well-trained staff. So kick off your shoes, sit back, relax and re-visit part of a past era. Introduce your children to one of the old-time pleasures of childhood."
