Chamber's New Location Open for Business


ong the site of famous performers and headliner events, Proctor's Theater in ✓ downtown Troy is embarking on a new chapter in its history: home to the Rensselaer County Regional Chamber of Commerce and its mission to serve our membership and the regional business community. The exciting move hails a new era for the nationally recognized building as well as the surrounding neighborhood of businesses, offices and residences. As the building's anchor tenant, the Chamber, collaborating with other stakeholders, will play a leading role in the ongoing renaissance of downtown. The Chamber has signed a 10-year lease with Columbia Development Companies to occupy a portion of the landmark building's first floor and its entire second floor, approximately 5,000 square feet that includes office space and conference rooms.


Working for more than one year, the Chamber's board of directors conducted a formal RFP and search process that considered 14 potential

sites located throughout Rensselaer County. Considerations included space, cost, member access and time frame. The selection of the Proctor's building as our new home reaffirms the Chamber's commitment to the continued revitalization of downtown Troy and its impact on the entire county.

Closed since 1971, Proctor's is undergoing a \$1.7 million renovation to create 22,000 square feet of space. The Chamber's new space includes a large first floor conference room and seven offices, two work stations and a smaller conference room on the second floor. The building's historic terra cotta facade will be restored and a new marquee similar to the original one will be installed. The outside facade of the building will be renovated in keeping with, and in respect for, its historic heritage.

ASK THE EXPERT: Education

Robert Horan is superintendent of the Schodack Central School District. With his experience in technology and business education and administration, he works to build educational partnerships to enhance learning.



Q: How are local school districts changing?

A: Schools, as well as businesses, are required to be more efficient than ever before. Efficiency doesn't always mean eliminating staff, it means thinking outside of the box. Our district is cutting energy costs with solar panels, sharing services with other districts, and repurposing space by collaborating with businesses and the community.

Q: What can schools do to meet challenges?

A: The greatest challenges can become the greatest opportunities. To address declining enrollment, we're creating a middle school environment for 7th and 8th graders within our high school. This gives us the opportunity, through a capital project, to modernize our science labs, provide larger space for music and art and create flexible classrooms. It also allows us to repurpose the middle school for business and community uses. The Schodack Schools' Accelerator program already provides 5,000 square feet of business space to start-up companies and entrepreneurs. The YMCA is running a pilot satellite program with spin bikes and weight equipment, and both Questar and a local pre-school are using the space.

Q: How are students benefiting?

A: Tenants using our space enter into a partnership. Businesses share knowledge and internships with our faculty and students, providing "real-world" experience for 21st century jobs and careers. The YMCA has donated fitness equipment for school use. These kinds of dynamic and collaborative strategies are bringing increased opportunities to students, staff and the community, while being financially responsible and forward-thinking.

The Capital District Transportation Authority

(CDTA) is experiencing tremendous growth and record ridership, thanks to redesigned services, a growing partner base and the introduction of BusPlus, CDTA's Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) service. CDTA's plan to implement 40 miles of

enhanced service along the region's high-volume corridors includes expanded services in Rensselaer County via the River Corridor BRT line.

"We are working diligently on the expansion of our BRT network and placement of transit centers at key locations," said David M. Stackrow, CDTA chairman of the board. "The River Corridor BRT line will provide Rensselaer County with faster travel and enhanced waiting areas with advanced information and security features. Most importantly, we are connecting people with jobs and opportunities. The renewal of Troy and continued growth of the county are in line with our ability to get people where they need to go."

The River Corridor BusPlus line will connect Waterford, Lansingburgh and Troy with downtown Albany via limited stop service. The line will travel via NY Route 32, Broadway and US Route 4 between the Port of Albany and North Troy, with branches to the City of Cohoes and the Village of Waterford. BusPlus Stations with real-time information signs to make trip-planning easier will be supported by better amenities at 26 peak locations. BusPlus will reduce the number of stops between destinations and improve the riding experience for customers looking for a more sustainable way to travel.

CDTA is the region's premier mobility provider, serving 16.5 million riders last year. Owner-operator of the Rensselaer Rail Station and Saratoga Springs Train Station, CDTA employs 650 people who work to transport nearly 60,000 customers each weekday.


