ASK A BOARD MEMBER Women Business Enterprises (WBE)

Lisa Despart is the president of AWCplus, a family business founded in 1979. She has served as president since 2003, utilizing her extensive business and leadership skills to triple company sales. AWCplus is a New York State certified Women Business Enterprise, providing



commercial window cleaning, pressure washing, aerial maintenance and custom services.

O: What are the advantages of being a certified Women Business Enterprise (WBE)? A: The advantages of having the WBE certification can vary depending upon your industry. For my company, one major benefit is all New York State contracts, including construction projects financed by the state, are required to use WBE or MWBE (Minority Women Business Enterprise) companies for 30% of contract costs. As AWCplus offers services needed on these contracts, hiring my company can help meet the New York State initiatives and provide customers with quality, professional services. There are also a number of private companies with diversity goals and we can work with them as well. Pricing still needs to be competitive. Contracts are not simply handed to a company that is a WBE. Additionally, as AWCplus is part of a male-dominated industry, this certification gives my company an opportunity to differentiate itself from organizations offering similar services.

Q: Is the certification process difficult?

A: I would encourage anyone considering applying to reach out to a couple of WBE's and learn from their experiences, take advantage of the informational seminars offered by NYS Empire State Development and have a second pair of eyes (such as a WBE expert) review the application before submitting. Lastly, should your application be denied (and you believe wrongly so), you do have recourse with the appeal process. The system is not perfect and some cases mistakenly fall through the cracks (as mine did). Do not give up!

Q: How do you maintain your certification? A: The business needs to continue to be owned and led by a woman. Every three years


