ASK A BOARD MEMBER:

Today's Health Care Delivery

Scarlet Clement-Buffoline, MS, is the Chief Operating Officer of St. Peter's Health Partners Acute Care. She oversees the daily operations of Samaritan Hospital, St. Mary's Campus, St. Peter's Hospital and Albany Memorial Hospital.



Q » How is health care delivery changing?

A » For many years, health care was hospitalcentric with the focus on treating illness and recovery. The new health care landscape is patient-centered with an emphasis on wellness, prevention and outpatient treatment. Today's health care is delivered more often within the communities where people live and work, through collaborative relationships with primary care physicians and the patients themselves. Most health care facilities are putting resources into community locations and services that reach the patient population where they are and in ways that empower them as health care consumers.

Q » What trends are driving the delivery of care?

A » Recognizing the social determinants of health as well as medical needs is an important trend. Factors that shape a patient's health, such as socioeconomic status, education, neighborhood, physical environment, employment, access to transportation and social support networks all affect health care outcomes. Initiatives, including state and federal programs, are seeking to identify and address how healthrelated social needs affect health costs, reduce inpatient and outpatient utilization and impact patient outcomes.

Q » How can small businesses adapt to trends?

A » Small and emerging businesses often prove to be very creative and flexible to changing markets. Businesses that place an emphasis on employee wellness are better able to attract and retain a healthy workforce, which in turn lowers costs and gives them more engaged employees. Businesses can partner with existing resources, such as Walk with a Doc (walkwithadoc.org), to encourage healthy lifestyles among their staff members. This type of strategy can generate positives outcomes that make a difference to businesses and to individuals.


