ASK A BOARD MEMBER: **Business & Philanthropy**

Kate Otis is Community Development Officer for Saratoga National Bank and Trust Company. With more than 13 years in community relations, she strategically manages corporate philanthropy and develops relationships with community



stakeholders while serving on the boards of local civic and nonprofit organizations.

Q » How is philanthropy good for business?

A » Giving back to the communities that support our businesses is the right thing to do and is paid forward in many ways. There are a few things that can help maximize your ability to impact change both in the community and within the company. Q » How does philanthropy affect employees and recruitment and retainment efforts?

A » Giving employees a voice to help determine how a company gives back to the community is empowering and will help ensure philanthropy is meaningful to company culture. It is important to consider what your team is passionate about and to focus on areas that you can rally your company around. When employees are engaged in community support, they have a more positive outlook of the company and feel like part of a team. This sense of excitement and pride translates to employee satisfaction and increased positive brand reputation. Community support can also assist with retention and recruitment efforts. Job applicants are increasingly interested in corporate culture as it relates to community involvement. Being able to tell your company's story helps attract and retain top talent. With meaningful philanthropy, your employees and the community will be inspired to tell your story for you. And the best part is improving the community, where your employees live, work and play.




