Building Strong Communities



Christine Nealon is the President and CEO of TRIP, Inc. (Troy Rehabilitation and Improvement Program) & RCHR (Rensselaer County Housing

Resources). Both organizations work to build strong communities by meeting the growing housing needs of local residents.

Q » As we proceed through the second year of the pandemic, how have TRIP & RCHR adjusted to providing services to individuals?

A » Making TRIP & RCHR's services available to the community online was one of our pre-pandemic initiatives. But the health and safety protocols required for COVID-19 certainly expedited the need for social distancing and virtual access to TRIP & RCHR's many programs and services. We've launched our customer service portals for homeownership promotion classes, along with a tenant portal that enables current and prospective tenants to do everything online, from applying for an apartment to paying their rent. Effective tools for communication are more essential now than ever before and TRIP & RCHR are committed to working with neighbors to achieve a strong community during these challenging times.

Q » What are some of your greatest challenges?

A » We face the challenge of being able to communicate with our customers who have inconsistent internet access. At first, we thought people didn't have their internet turned on or maybe did not have a computer in their home at all. But what we've learned is that the infrastructure for broadband access in many of the areas we serve simply does not support the overwhelming demand, especially since COVID-19's outbreak. Imagine being a parent with two children trying to get their education from their school remotely and you are working remotely and juggling all the responsibilities of a household, while taking turns using a deficient internet signal. Inadequate access to information via online sources is now threatening basic human needs like healthcare, housing, education and employment. It definitely makes it a challenge for us to maintain communication with our customers.

Q » As chair of The Leadership Institute committee and an alumna, how has the program assisted your career?

A» I am honored to chair The Leadership
Institute committee this year. The Chamber's
Leadership program has assisted me in my
career in many ways, increasing connections to
other professionals and businesses that I might
not otherwise have had the opportunity to
meet. Creating a shared business culture among
emerging leaders where diversity and equity
are valued is a priceless experience at the
individual, business and community levels.

The Institute, launched in the fall of 2020, offers public programs, conferences and community partnerships with a focus on constructive dialogue about contemporary women's issues. The Institute also promotes women's leadership and gender inclusivity through a student-learning community with women-only housing and expanded curricular opportunities.

The result of Russell Sage College's overall strategic plan, the Institute began its activities with a five-part inaugural symposium last fall that marked the centennial of women's suffrage. More than 1,000 individuals participated in the virtual series and the Institute has continued to build on the momentum. In February, it co-hosted an event for Black History Month that looked at racial inequity in the judicial system, a collaboration with the college's Office of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion. On March 1, the Institute is presenting a virtual fireside chat with Irin Carmon and Shana Knizhnik, co-authors of Notorious RBG: The Life and Times of Ruth Bader Ginsburg. A panel discussion on "The Pandemic and Social Inequities," is set for April 15, featuring experts speaking on health care disparities, domestic violence, unpaid care and disruptions to K-12 public education. These events are free and open to the public.

With the enthusiastic assistance of Russell Sage College student ambassadors, the Institute is growing on many levels, increasing its social media presence, collaborating with partners on and off campus, and planning a new associate scholar program for next year.

Pay Equity Audit Webinar with Dowling Law



For most employees, pay equity is a hot topic. Employers in New York State are now required to pay staff equally for equal work and even for substantially similar work. - Intervention includes developing strategies for de-escalation, using individual and family strengths and supports, identifying of coping skills and determining whether the individual can stay safely in the community or requires a higher level of care.
- Facilitating hospitalization with report provided to emergency staff in the hospital. Please note, however, that inpatient admission is always at the discretion of the hospital.
