Return of the Van Rensselaer Awards Dinner!

Reserve your place at the Chamber's 2022 Van Rensselaer Awards Dinner, a celebration of excellence in the regional business community. Held in-person for the first time since 2019, these prestigious honors recognize the exceptional dedication and commitment of three recipients whose leadership during the COVID-19 pandemic assisted our communities to respond and recover. It is clear that these recipients, working on the front lines of the pandemic, played outstanding roles during the events of the past two years and are deserving of recognition.

The Van Rensselaer Corporate Award will be presented to St. Peter's Health Partners (SPHP):

The region's largest non-profit health care network responded to the pandemic by increasing bed capacity and working to secure PPE to help health care workers stay safe. SPHP expanded its virtual health services to better connect patients with health care providers and offered COVID testing at primary locations and urgent care centers throughout the region. In December 2020, SPHP became the area's first health care institution to offer monoclonal antibody therapy, the only FDAauthorized COVID treatment. SPHP has expanded its monoclonal therapy outreach to eligible COVID-positive residents of its skilled nursing facilities. With 170 locations and 12,000 employees, the impact SPHP has had on individuals, communities and our region in the ST PETER'S HEALTH past year is significant.

emergency medical providers, care coordinators, nurse practitioners, physician assistants and ER physicians, used their virtual capabilities to triage patients and treat as needed or direct them to appropriate care. UCM Digital Health continues to support individuals around the clock, sharing important COVID resources.

placing her at the heart of the area's response to COVID-19. Under her leadership, the county established a Point Of Distribution (POD) at Hudson Valley Community College to provide vaccinations and also operated community vaccination clinics at locations throughout the county. In May of 2021, Rensselaer County reached an important milestone: 300,000 testings for COVID in one year. Opening its own testing facility proved to be key in battling the spread of COVID cases in Rensselaer County. Throughout the pandemic, the health department, led by Wachunas, has spent days, nights and weekends providing information and comfort to county residents. She has served as public health director since 2006 and is former director of the county's Children With Special Needs program. VISIT rensco.com



ASK A BOARD MEMBER:

Workforce Challenges & Solutions

Kendra Hart is the President of Martin Electric, located in East Greenbush. Balancing her business acumen with her passion for people, she is responsible for managing the company's policies and procedures, analyzing the financial data, cultivating a safe work environment, and creating



a team-oriented culture. When Kendra is not in the field. you can find her in classrooms across the community speaking to students and teachers about careers in the trades.

Q » What alternate solutions has Martin Electric found to overcome the nationwide workforce shortage?

- A » While there is always the option to work crews longer hours, we recognize that is not a sustainable solution for what's likely a long-term problem. Not only does it lower productivity and increase employee burnout, but also poses a safety risk for employees. Therefore, we've leaned into the "work smarter, not harder" motto which meant rethinking when, where and how work can be done. Over the last year, we expanded our offsite manufacturing capabilities, implemented more technology into our practice, and more intentionally matched employee skills to tasks. As a long-term approach, we started an internship program to recruit recent high school graduates or current seniors in vocational programs like BOCES, who are interested in the electrical trade to work in our warehouse. Normally we have 1-2 interns, this year we have 5. Our goal for our interns is to go on through the apprenticeship program and ultimately become quality foreman in the industry.
- **Q** » Do you have any recommendations for current vocational programs that would benefit employers and future jobseekers?
- **A** » As a community, we must focus on strengthening our partnerships between vocational programs, trade unions, and contractors to create a more direct pipeline from the classroom to the field. Another benefit to creating this collaborative

ecosystem would be the ability to share resources including teachers/mentors, training curriculum/



facilities, opportunities, etc. I believe work-based learning should be a requirement of all highschool curriculum and not just for vocational programs. We know the importance of teaching soft skills, but it's often difficult to teach soft skills in a traditional classroom setting; I believe the work-based learning experience would provide a better place for students to develop these skills essential for their success.

Q » What was a skill you learned in high school that you feel was essential to your success?

A » My high school had "May projects" which required internship experience during the month of May in order to graduate. It gave me some insight into marketing and event planning, and I quickly realized that it might not be everything it looked like on TV! I quickly changed my major going into college from marketing to accounting, but had I taken an internship in the field with the electricians, I may have been able to save on college tuition all together!






